Gas meters and service pipes should never be used to store tools, extension cords, or tether animals. Instruct children not to climb or play on the meter, as extra weight or force can damage it and the piping. If your meter is damaged or if you smell natural gas near the meter, call us immediately. Please do not attempt to service or maintain the meter yourself.

RECIPE

Red, White and Blue Fruit Tart

Ingredients

For the crust:

1 pie crust from a box **For the filling:**

- 1-8 ounce package cream cheese, softened
- ½ cup sugar
- 1 teaspoon vanilla bean paste

For the fruit topping:

- 4 large strawberries, sliced 1½ cups blackberries ¼ cup blueberries
- 1/2 cup raspberries



- 1. Heat the oven to 450°F.
- Carefully unroll the dough and place in the tart pan. Use your fingers to press the dough firmly into the pan, making sure to press along the sides as well before pricking with a fork (to prevent air bubbles).
- 3. Bake the tart crust for 10-12 minutes or until golden brown. Allow the crust to cool completely before adding the cream cheese filling.
- Add the cream cheese, sugar, and vanilla bean paste to a medium bowl and use a mixer to beat at medium speed until smooth. Evenly spread the filling to cover the entire crust.
- 5. Arrange fruit as shown (or in any pattern you like) on top of the cream cheese filling.
