Why It's Critical to Report Hit Lines and Damaged Gas Meters

Every day, underground natural gas lines quietly do the job of delivering energy to homes, businesses, and communities across the region. But when one of these lines is accidentally struck—whether by construction equipment, landscaping tools, or even a vehicle—it creates a serious safety hazard that requires immediate attention.

What Is a “Hit Line”?

A hit line refers to any instance where an underground gas line is accidentally struck, scratched, or disturbed—no matter how minor it may seem. Even a small nick or dent in a gas pipe can lead to:

- Dangerous gas leaks
- Fire or explosion hazards
- Service interruptions
- Costly emergency repairs

What to Do If You Strike, and/or See a Damaged Line or Meter?

1. Stop working immediately and move to a safe distance (approx. 300ft away)
2. Do not use electronics or open flames near the area
3. Call 911 if you suspect a gas leak
4. Contact Wyoming Gas Company at 1-800-799-6427
5. Wait for professionals to assess and repair the damage

Prevention Is Key: Call Before You Dig!

Before any digging project, big or small, always call 811 to have underground utilities located. It's free, it's fast, and it could save lives.

RECIPE:

No- Bake Cheesecake

CRUST

- 1 ½ cups finely crushed graham cracker
- ¼ cup white sugar
- 2 tablespoons unsweetened cocoa powder
- 6 tablespoons butter, melted



FILLING

- 1 cup cream cheese at room temperature
- 1 cup mascarpone cheese at room temperature
- 2 teaspoons grated lemon zest
- 2 teaspoons lemon juice
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 1/3 cup white sugar
- 1 ¾ cups cold heavy whipping cream
- Strawberries for topping as needed

DIRECTIONS

1. Combine graham cracker crumbs, ¼ cup sugar, cocoa powder and melted butter in a bowl until crumbly.
2. Press mixture into an 8 ½ x 11-inch baking dish. Refrigerate for 30 minutes.
3. Mix cream cheese and mascarpone; stir in lemon zest, lemon juice, and vanilla extract.
4. Whisk 1/3 cup sugar into whipping cream until fluffy and soft peaks form, fold into the cheese mixture.
5. Spread filling over the crust, tap to settle. Refrigerate for 3 hours.
6. Place your strawberries on top and enjoy!
