





Colder Months are Upon us, Start Preparing Now!

Wyoming Gas-Guide to Help You Save Money This Fall /Winter Season:

- Keep thermostats low and consistent
- Look into winterizing your home
- Apply for Low Income Energy Assistance Program (LIEAP)



Why Winterize Your Home?

Winterizing protects your home from freezing temperatures, lowers energy cost, and helps avoid costly damage. Scan the QR code for info on winterizing your home.



How to Winterize Your Home:

1. Seal drafts and insulate
2. Protect plumbing
3. Maintain your heating system
4. Check the fireplace & chimney
5. Prep roof & gutters

Bonus tips: Reverse ceiling fan to spin clockwise- this helps push warm air back down. Keep your garage door closed to protect pipes and retain heat.

Low Income Energy Assistance Program (LIEAP):

LIEAP (Low Income Energy Assistance Program) is a federally funded program that will help people pay heating bills during the winter heating season. The program is open to homeowners and renters. It helps cover the cost of electricity, natural gas, propane, wood, diesel heating oil, coal and pellets when these are used for heating a home.

If you or someone you know needs assistance with heating bills this winter, please contact the Department of Family Services (DFS) at 800-457-3659 or Wyoming LIEAP at 800-246-4221 to get more information. Applications are accepted from October 1, 2025 through April 30, 2026. Weatherization applications are accepted year round. More information available at LIEAPWYO.org.

QUICK TIP:

As colder months approach, it's important to remember that snow and ice can build up on natural gas meters. This may make them difficult to read and could interfere with proper operation. To keep your meter safe and accessible, gently clear snow and ice using a broom or brush. Never kick, strike, or chip away buildup with hard objects, as this may cause damage.

RECIPE: Grilled Breakfast Sandwiches

Ingredients: (This recipe makes 4 sandwiches)

- 4 Everything Bagels
- 4 Breakfast Sausage Patties
- Salt & Pepper to taste
- 4 Slices of Cheddar Cheese
- 4 Eggs
- ¼ Cup of Mayonnaise
- 1 Tomato, thinly sliced
- Lettuce



Directions:

1. Heat grill to medium (350°F–450°F) with a cast iron griddle.
2. Cook sausage patties 3–4 minutes per side, or until they reach 165°F.
3. Toast bagels on the top rack.
4. While meat rests, fry eggs on the griddle.
5. Assemble: meat on bun base, top with egg, tomato, lettuce, and mayonnaise.
6. Serve & enjoy.
