Top Tips for Winter Weather

Keep your home warm – safely!

- Never use natural gas appliances, such as a stove, oven or grill to heat homes or businesses.
- Make sure that outdoor vent openings and air intakes are not obstructed by snow or ice. Your natural gas appliances, including your furnace, fireplace, water heater, and clothes dryer, require good ventilation to operate properly.
- Natural gas is odorized to smell like rotten eggs. If you smell it, be sure to leave your house immediately and call 9-1-1 or your local gas utility from a safe location.

Protect your natural gas meter.

- Keep water from dripping from your roof and freezing on the meter.
- Carefully remove icicles and snow build-up from roof eaves above the meter and on the meter itself.
- If your meter is covered in snow, safely remove it by using a brush or a broom. If it's covered in ice, call your local utility for help. Never use a shovel or hard object to remove snow from a meter, and don't kick it or strike it, either.
- Be careful using a shovel, snow blower, or snowplow when clearing snow and ice near your natural gas meter. When clearing walks or drives, do not pile snow on or near the meter.
- Do not use sharp objects, salt, ice melting chemicals, or hot water to remove snow and ice from the meter.
- Know what's below. Call 8-1-1 before digging into the ground for any reason.

Falling temperatures...how to save on your natural gas bill:

- Keep doors and windows closed during cold weather.
- Open shades during the day when the sun is shining to take advantage of the sun's warmth.
- Bundle up! Put on an extra sweater and lower the thermostat.
- If you are struggling, know there is help. If you are unable to afford your heating costs, weatherization or energy-related home repairs, contact your utility or contact the Low Income Energy Assistance Program (LIEAP) for help.
- Finally, check your home's insulation to make sure it's properly insulated and make any updates before cold weather hits.

Fun Facts About Natural Gas!

Diverse Applications: Beyond heating and cooking, natural gas is used to produce everyday products such as vinyl flooring, cell phones, and even medical devices like heart valves and artificial limbs.

Recipe: Pull Apart Christmas Tree

Ingredients:

- 7 mozzarella sticks
- All-purpose flour for dusting
- 1lb. store-bought or homemade Pizza dough, room temperature
- 1 large egg
- 4 Tbsp. unsalted butter, melted
- 1 oz. Parmesan, finely grated (about ½ cup per serving)
- 1 Tbsp finely chopped fresh parsley
- 1 Tbsp finely chopped fresh rosemary
- 1 Tbsp thinly sliced fresh basil
- Crushed red pepper flakes and warmed marinara for serving

Directions:

1. Place rack in middle of oven, pre-heat oven to 450°F, cut cheese sticks into 5 slices.
2. Form dough balls: Roll out pizza dough, cut into squares, and wrap each around a piece of cheese to form sealed balls.
3. Arrange: Place balls seam side down on a parchment-lined sheet in a Christmas tree shape.
4. Egg wash: Brush with beaten egg and water.
5. Bake: Cook 15–20 minutes until golden.
6. Finish: Brush with melted butter mixed with Parmesan and herbs; sprinkle with Parmesan, parsley, and red pepper flakes. Serve with marinara sauce.
