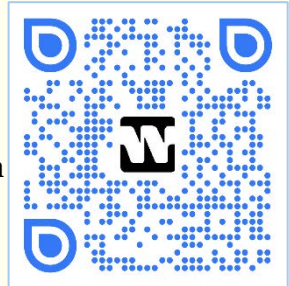

Colder Months are Approaching Fast, Let's Start Prepping Now!

Colder weather is approaching fast, and right now is the perfect time to prepare your home for the heating season!

Wyoming Gas encourages customers to schedule the following:

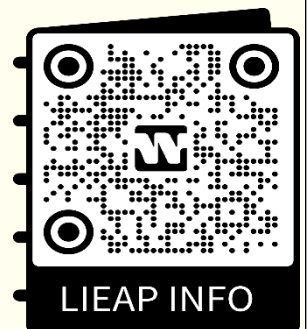
1. Furnace tune-up. Regular maintenance can help your furnaces operate safely and efficiently while keeping your home comfortable throughout the winter.
2. Look into winterizing your home. Winterizing your home from freezing temperatures lowers energy cost and helps avoid costly damages. Scan the QR code for info on winterizing your home.
3. Apply for the Low Income Energy Assistance Program (LIEAP)- LIEAP is a federally funded program that will help people pay heating bills during the winter heating season. The program is open to homeowners and renters. It helps cover the cost of electricity, natural gas, propane, wood, diesel heating oil, coal and pellets when these are used for heating a home.

Applications are accepted from October 1, 2026, through April 30, 2027. Weatherization applications are accepted year-round. Fun Facts About Natural Gas!

In America, Colonel Edwin Drake drilled the first successful natural gas and oil wells in 1859. His well was only 69ft deep, while modern wells can go as deep as 30,000 ft, reaching huge reserves underground.

RECIPE: Stuffed Butternut Squash

Ingredients:

- 2 tbsp olive oil, salt and pepper
- 2 medium butternut squash halved & seeded
- 1 lb. spicy breakfast sausage
- 4 minced garlic cloves, 1 small red onion diced, 2 tbsp. chopped sage
- 6oz cremini mushrooms chopped, 1 cup kale, 1 cup of cooked brown rice
- 1 cup grated gruyere, ¼ cup freshly grated parmesan cheese
- 1/4 cup chopped fresh parsley

Directions:

1. Roast seasoned squash cut-side down at 400°F for 40–45 minutes, until tender. Season with salt and pepper.
2. Brown sausage. Sauté garlic, onion, mushrooms, and sage. Add kale and rice. Mix with sausage and Gruyère.
3. Scoop a trench in the squash and fill it with sausage mixture. Bake 10–12 minutes until hot and cheese melts. Top with parmesan and parsley and serve.
